Representative Matters at Previous Firm

Represented Light & Wonder (formerly Scientific Games) in putative class action and individual antitrust litigation filed in Illinois federal court, and in an arbitration before the American Arbitration Association, involving *Walker Process* antitrust monopolization claims that concern automatic card shufflers used in casinos.
