Throughout his career, Mr. Rocos has been dedicated to providing pro bono legal assistance for underrepresented communities, resulting in positive outcomes that have impacted thousands of individuals. Mr. Rocos was also awarded the ACLU of Southern California's 2021 Humanitarian Award for his efforts in two COVID-19 class action lawsuits to advocate for the Eighth Amendment rights of federal prisoners - a case that garnered widespread national attention.
