

Bird Marella Secures Non-Custodial Sentence in Long-Running Healthcare Fraud Case

Bird Marella attorneys <u>Nicole Rodriguez Van Dyk</u>, <u>Benjamin Gluck</u>, and <u>Naomi Solomon</u> secured a non-custodial sentence for their client, a former pharmacy owner, in a longrunning healthcare fraud case with alleged loss amounts as high as \$60 million. Under the Guidelines, the alleged loss amount would have resulted in a recommended range of 16-19 years in custody. Bird Marella has represented the client since 2016 when he was first charged as part of a DOJ investigation in what the <u>Los Angeles Times</u> called the "nation's biggest healthcare fraud probe."
