

Bird Marella Obtains Preliminary Injunction in a Mobile App Technology Trade Secrets Action

On July 22, 2021, the Court granted Bird Marella's motion for a preliminary injunction finding a likelihood of success on the merits of the misappropriation of trade secrets and breach of contract claims and a likelihood of irreparable harm, thereby protecting the client's intellectual property rights.
